ORDER {PROHIBITING OR RESRICTING} OUTDOOR BURNING


WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY the Commissioners Court of Hopkins County and the City of Como that all outdoor burning is prohibited in all areas of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier on a determination made by: (1) the Texas Forest Service that drought conditions no longer exist; or (2) the County Judge and the County Fire Marshal based on a determination that the circumstances that required the order no longer exist.


This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for (1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Natural Resources Code 153.048 and meet the standards of Natural Resources Code 153.047; (5) commercial welding projects w/plan of action on file.

In accordance with Local Government Code 352.08 (h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

ADOPTED this 19TH day of July, 2022 by a vote of 3 ayes and 0 nays.





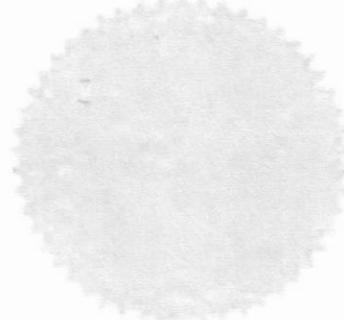

ORDINANCE O-2022-07-026 - 2

ORDINANCE [PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING] OUTDOOR BURNING IN THE CITY LIMITS, CITY OF CUMBY TEXAS


WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cumby, Texas finds that circumstances present in all or part of the incorporated area of the city create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the City Council of the City of Cumby, Texas that all outdoor burning is prohibited in all areas of the City for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Ordinance, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by: (1) the Texas Forest Service that drought conditions no longer exist; or (2) the Mayor of City of Cumby; that the circumstances that required the Order no longer exist.


This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code §352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Ordinance does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for: (1) firefighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or, (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Natural Resources Code § 153.048 and meet the standards of Natural Resources Code § 153.047; (5) commercial welding projects w/plan of action on file.


In accordance with Local Government Code §352.081(h), a violation of this Ordinance is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

Order (prohibiting/restricting) Outdoor Burning

Whereas, the City of Tira finds that circumstances present in all or part of the incorporated area of the City limits create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Tira City Council that ALL outdoor burning is prohibited in all areas of the city limits for 90 days from the date of adoption of this order, unless the restriction is terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service that drought conditions no longer exist. Or the Mayor and the County Fire Marshall based on a determination that the circumstances that require the Order no longer exist.

This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government code 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for: (1) firefighter training, (2) public utilities, natural gas pipeline or mining operations, (3) planting or harvesting of agriculture crops, or (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Natural Resources Code 153.047, (5) commercial welding projects, w/plan of action of file.

In accordance with Local Government Code 352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine no to exceed \$500.00.
