



Hopkins County Total Solar Eclipse EAP/IAP

Hopkins County will experience a total solar eclipse on April 8, 2024. It will begin at 12:24pm and end at 3:04pm with totality between 1:42pm and lasting for 4 minutes and 20.7 seconds. With it being on the center line and having a long totality time, it makes our county a favorable location for viewing.

From the information that has been gathered, it appears that Hopkins County will have around 15,000 visitors. This number is based on the reservations of hotels, RV, and camping sites. There will be monitoring of private land use for lodging and parking and it will be updated regularly. We will expect more visitors without lodging reservations on Sunday and Monday, especially if the weather is favorable.

For nearly two years, the Hopkins County Emergency Management Team has been discussing and planning for the total solar eclipse in Hopkins County. This team has worked closely with the Hopkins County Chamber of Commerce on having a location (website) for events and general information to flow. Multiple stakeholders have attended our meetings which allows for better organization of resource allocation, which will be limited.

Hopkins County first responders will be upstaffing for this event and multiple redundancies are in place to support continuity of operations.

Attached are the ICS forms for EOC operations for the event. It is written to easily adjust to an incident if necessary. New updates will be provided during each operational period.

INCIDENT OBJECTIVES (ICS 202)



VI. ORGANIZATION & ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBLIITIES

A. General

- Our normal emergency organization, described in Section VI.A of the Basic Plan and depicted in Attachment 3 to the Basic Plan, will carry out shelter and mass care operations.
- 2. Operations will be organized in accordance with NIMS guidelines.
- 3. We expect to be assisted by the ARC, other volunteer organizations active in disaster, and local volunteer groups and charitable organizations in conducting shelter and mass care operations. The Shelter Officer is responsible for coordinating the efforts of local government, volunteer groups, and other agencies involved in shelter and mass care operations.

B. Task Assignments

- The Hopkins County Judge will:
 - Direct the opening of local shelter and mass care facilities and the closing of such facilities when they are no longer needed.
 - b) Approve release of emergency public information materials on shelter locations and guidance on what people should bring and not bring to public shelters prepared by the public information staff.
 - Coordinate shelter and mass care efforts with other local governments, where appropriate.
 - Request shelter and mass care support from other local governments or the State if local resources are insufficient.

2. The EMC will:

- a) Coordinate shelter and mass care planning with the Shelter Officer, the PIO, the Human Services Officer, other local officials, and volunteer organizations.
- b) When the situation warrants, recommend to the Hopkins County Judge that shelter and mass care operations be implemented. Recommendations on the number of facilities to be activated and specific facilities to be used should be coordinated if possible with the volunteer organizations that will operate those facilities.
- c) Coordinate with the functional managers in the EOC to provide support for shelter and mass care activities.
- d) Receive reports on shelter and feeding operations from the Shelter & Mass Care Officer. During major emergencies, summarize shelter and mass care activities in the periodic Situation Report; see Annex N, Direction & Control, concerning this report.

e) When conditions warrant, recommend to the Hopkins County Judge that shelter and mass care facilities be closed

The Incident Commander will:

Identify requirements for shelter and mass care support needed as a result of an evacuation.

4. The Volunteer Coordinator shall serve as Shelter Officer and will:

- a) Identify volunteer organizations that are willing to support local shelter and mass care activities. See Appendix 1 to Annex O.
- In coordination with volunteer organizations that normally operate shelters and feeding facilities, identify potential shelter and mass care facilities. See Appendix 1 to this annex.
- c) Develop emergency agreements with volunteer groups for the use of facilities owned by local government as shelters and encourage other agencies, organizations, and groups that have suitable facilities to sign similar agreements.
- d) Develop cooperative agreements with volunteer organizations relating to shelter and mass care support. See Appendix 2 for pertinent information.
- e) Coordinate and disseminate common shelter operating guidelines to volunteer organizations operating shelters.
- f) Ensure mass care facilities are adequately staffed and equipped.
- g) Coordinate mass feeding where needed. Coordinate with HHSC officials for supplementary food stocks from USDA sources if required.
- Identify requirements for human services support for evacuees in shelters to the Human Services Officer.
- Identify requirements for facility security and fire protection requirements for shelters to law enforcement agencies and the fire service.
- j) Coordinate resource support for shelter operations.
- k) Receive reports on shelter and mass care operations and provide summary information for inclusion in the periodic Situation Report.
- Respond to disaster welfare inquiries until that function is assumed by the ARC.

Shelter Managers will:

- a) Staff and open shelters and keep them operating as long as necessary.
- b) Register shelter occupants and assist in answering disaster welfare inquiries.
- c) Arrange for mass feeding if required.
- d) Identify additional resource requirements to the Shelter Officer.
- e) Coordinate with the Shelter Officer to provide individual and family support services as needed.
- f) Submit a daily mass care facility status report to the Shelter Officer that indicates the number of shelter occupants, the number of meals served, and the condition of the facility, and also identifies any problem areas.
- g) Maintain records of supplies received and expended.
- h) When directed, terminate operations, turn in equipment and unused supplies, return the facility to its original condition, and submit a final report mass care facility status report.

6. The Hopkins County Sheriff will:

- a) Provide security and law enforcement at shelter and mass care facilities.
- b) Provide back-up communications, if needed.

7. The Hopkins County Fire Chief will:

- a) Inspect shelter and mass care facilities for fire safety.
- b) Provide and maintain shelter fire extinguishers.
- c) Train shelter management personnel in fire safety and fire suppression.

8. The Transportation Officer will:

- a) Arrange transportation for evacuees in shelters to feeding sites if necessary.
- b) Arrange transportation for shelter equipment, food, clothing, blankets, comfort kits, and other shelter supplies to shelter and mass care facilities.
- Upon request, provide transportation for return of evacuees without vehicles to their homes.

9. The Health and Medical Officer will:

- a) Coordinate basic medical assistance for individuals in mass care facilities.
- b) Monitor health and sanitation conditions in mass care facilities.

10. The Human Services Officer will:

- Coordinate provision of clothing, blankets, personal care items and other items to evacuees.
- Upon request, coordinate disaster mental health services for occupants of mass care facilities.

11. The PIO will:

- a) Provide information to the public on the locations of shelters and shelter operating policies.
- Provide updates on the emergency situation to shelter managers to be passed on to shelter occupants.
- Provide public information on closure of shelters and return of evacuees to their homes.

12. The Animal Control Officer will:

- a) Coordinate arrangements to provide temporary facilities for evacuees arriving at shelter and mass care facilities with pets.
- b) Be prepared to provide shelter managers with information on procedures for handling evacuees with pets.

13. The American Red Cross

Pursuant to a cooperative agreement between the ARC and us, the ARC has agreed to do the following:

a) Staff and operate shelter and mass care facilities.

- b) Register evacuees.
- c) Provide mass feeding for victims and emergency workers.
- d) Provide emergency assistance for other essential needs.
- e) Process inquiries from concerned families outside the disaster area.
- 14. Sulphur Springs School Superintendent will:

Shelter students in school buildings when the situation warrants.

15. Oncor Utility Services will:

To the extent possible, ensure power, water supply, and sanitary services are operable at shelter and mass care facilities during emergency conditions.

16. Other Volunteer Groups

The following groups have agreed to provide the services indicated:

VII. DIRECTION AND CONTROL

A. General

- The Hopkins County Judge shall establish priorities for and provide policy guidance for shalter and mass care activities.
- The Hopkins County Judge will provide general direction to the Shelter Officer regarding shelter and mass care operations.
- The Shelter Officer will plan and manage the conduct of shelter and mass care activities, coordinating as necessary with volunteer organizations that participate in shelter operations or mass feeding and other departments and agencies.
- Shelter and feeding facility managers will be esponsible for the operation of their individual facilities.
- Methods of direction and control will be consistent with NIMS guidelines.
- B. Line of Succession
 - 903. The line of succession for the Shelter Officer is:
 - a. ARC Representative.
 - b. School Superintendent
 - School Principal
 - 903. The line of succession for other shelter and mass care personnel will be in accordance with existing policies and SOPs.

- d. Recommend condemnation of upsafe buildings.
- e. Review fire codes in relation to an incident or disaster and recommend improvements to County Commissioners.

VI. ORGANIZATION AND ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

A. General

- 1. Our normal emergency organization, described in Section VI.A and depicted in Attachment 3 of the Basic Plan, shall coordinate firefighting efforts conducted as part of emergency operations in accordance with NIMS. Most fires can be handled by fire service personnel, with limited support from one or two other emergency services, operating under an IC. The EOC will normally be activated during major emergencies and disasters involving significant fires or fires occurring simultaneously with other hazards. These situations may require the commitment of all emergency services and external assistance. In such incidents, transition to a Multiagency Coordination System is advisable. In the event of a catastrophic incident, considerations will be made for the implementation of RRP.
- The Hopkins County Fire Chief shall serve as the Chief Fire Officer and coordinate emergency firefighting operations. A fire officer shall normally serve as the IC for the response to fires, hazmat incidents, oil spills, and radiological incidents.
- The Commissioner's Court may restrict outdoor burning and use of fireworks if drought conditions are determined to exist by the TFS (see Annex U, Legal).

B. Task Assignments

- The Hopkins County Fire Department/VFD's will:
 - a. Coordinate all fire service activities.
 - b. Provide fire control and protection.
 - c. Assist in warning and operation of warning sirens (see Annex A).
 - d. Provide support for shelter/mass care operations (see Annex C).
 - e. Provide support for radiological protection (see Annex D).
 - f. Provide assistance during evacuations (see Annex E).
 - q. Respond to hazmat accidents/incidents (see Annex Q).
 - h. Enforce fire codes.
 - Prepare and execute inter-local agreements.
 - j. Provide support for other public safety operations, as necessary.

- k. Conduct search and rescue operations (see Annex R).
- Provide qualified individuals to staff the EOC and ICPs when activated.

The IC will:

- a. Establish an ICP and control and direct emergency response resources.
- Assess the incident, request any additional resources needed, and provide periodic updates to the EOC, if activated.
- c. Determine and implement initial protective actions for emergency responders and the public in the vicinity of the incident site.
- d. Approve the Incident Action Plan and all requests pertaining to the procurement and release of incident resources.
- e. Establish a specific division of responsibilities between the incident command operation and the EOC, if activated.
- f. During an incident of national significance, make a situation assessment and coordinate resource needs, as required, with the NRF, ESF #4. Coordination shall be made through the Regional Unified Command (RUC), DDC, SOC, and TFS to the JFO (See NRF, ESF #4-Fire-fighting Annex).

Law Enforcement will:

Upon request of the IC, initiate evacuation actions and provide perimeter access control around incident sites.

4. The Hopkins County Commissioners will:

Upon request of the IC, provide heavy equipment support for fire control operations.

5. The TFS will:

- a. Detect and/or coordinate response to wildland fires in the state.
- b. Process requests for state firefighting assistance.
- Coordinate firefighting ESF group actions to develop and implement mutual aid programs and procedures.
- d. Coordinate firefighting activities and issues involving fire departments.
- e. Within capabilities, provide personnel and equipment to assist local governments and industry in conducting fire suppression operations.
- f. Conduct wildland fire training academies for state and local personnel.
- The U.S. Forest Service will:

Upon request from the TFS, provide support for local fire control operations when U.S. Forest Service lands are threatened.

7. The Hopkins County Attorney will:

Upon request, assist the Commissioner's Court by drafting legal documents enforcing outdoor burning and/or the use of fireworks (see Annex U).

VII. DIRECTION AND CONTROL

A. General

- For most emergency situations, an IC will establish an ICP to direct and control fire service operations at the scene from the ICP. The individual most qualified to deal with the specific type of emergency situation present should serve as the IC. This will typically be the senior fire service officer present. All fire service teams will carry out mission tasks assigned by the IC. The IC will be assisted by a staff, determined by the anticipated needs of the situation.
- 2. In some situations, the EOC may be activated without an incident command operation. This organizational arrangement is most likely when: (a) a hazard threatens, but has not yet impacted the local area (such as the predicted landfall of a hurricane), or (b) when a generalized threat exists and there is no identifiable incident site (as may be the case for a terrorist threat). During these situations, a senior fire service officer will normally report to the EOC to coordinate fire service actions.
- External response agencies are expected to conform to the general guidance provided by our senior decision-makers and carry out mission assignments directed by the IC or the EOC. However, organized response units will normally work under the immediate control of their own supervisors.
- 4. In emergency situations where other jurisdictions or state or federal agencies are providing significant response resources or technical assistance, it is generally desirable to transition from the normal ICS structure to a Unified Area Command structure. This arrangement helps to ensure that all participating agencies are involved in developing objectives and strategies to deal with the emergency.

B. Incident Command System - EOC Interface

When both the EOC and an ICP are activated, it is essential to establish a division of responsibilities between the IC and the EOC. A general division of responsibilities is outlined in Section V.D of Annex N. Direction and Control.

C. Line of Succession

The line of succession for the Chief Fire Officer is:

- 1. Hopkins County Fire Chief.
- 2. Hopkins County Fire Marshal or designee.
- 3. Lieutenant on duty at Station 20 (Central Station).
- Volunteer Fire Chief within their jurisdiction.

B. Task Assignments

- 1. Hopkins County Sheriff's Office will:
 - a. Prepare law enforcement inter-local agreements.
 - b. Maintain law and order during emergency situations.
 - c. Plan, direct, and control evacuations (see Annex E).
 - d. Provide security for key facilities.
 - e. Protect property in evacuated areas.
 - f. Provide access control to damaged areas.
 - g. Carry out traffic control when and where needed.
 - Provide crowd control when needed.
 - i. Manage the local warning system (see Annex A).
 - j. Manage the local emergency communications network (see Annex B).
 - k. Conduct counter-terrorism and anti-terrorist operations.
 - I. Support search and rescue operations (see Annex R).
 - m. Assist in hazardous materials incidents (See Annex Q).
 - n. Provide security for shelter and mass care operations (See Annex C).
 - o. If necessary, evacuate prisoners from the jail to another suitable facility.
 - p. Provide qualified individuals to staff the EOC and ICPs when those facilities are activated.
 - q. Support other emergency functions as necessary.

2. Constables will:

Upon request of the Sheriff, augment the Sheriff's Office during major emergencies.

2. Park Police/Game Warden/School District Police will:

Upon request of the Sheriff, augment the Sheriff's Office during major emergencies.

- 4. The Incident Commander will:
 - a. Establish an incident command post (ICP) and control and direct emergency response resources at the incident scene from that ICP to resolve the incident.
 - b. Provide an initial incident assessment, request additional resources if needed, and provide periodic updates to the EOC.
 - c. Establish a specific division of responsibilities between the incident command operation and the EOC, if the EOC has been activated.
 - d. Determine and implement initial protective actions for emergency responders and the public in the vicinity of the incident site.

- 5. Hopkins County Commissioners will:
 - a. Upon request, place traffic control devices to facilitate evacuation travel.
 - b. Assist in keeping evacuation routes open.
 - c. Upon request, provide barricades and barriers to restrict entry to evacuated and damaged areas.
- 6. Hopkins County Attorney will:

Upon request, advise law enforcement agencies regarding the emergency powers of local government and their potential impact on law enforcement requirements during emergency situations.

VII. DIRECTION & CONTROL

A. General

- Routine law enforcement operations may continue during some emergency situations.
 Direction and control of such operations will be by those that normally direct and control day-to-day operations.
- 2. For most emergency situations, an Incident Commander will establish an ICP at the scene and direct and control emergency operations at incident site from that command post; law enforcement and other resources committed to the incident will carry out missions assigned by the Incident Commander. The Incident Commander will be assisted by a staff with the expertise and of a size required for the tasks to be performed. The individual most qualified to deal with the specific type of emergency situation present should serve as the Incident Commander. Hence, for incidents that primarily involve a law enforcement matter, the senior law enforcement officer present will typically serve as the Incident Commander.
- 3. In some situations, the EOC may be activated without an incident command operation. This type of organizational arrangement is most likely when: (a) a hazard threatens, but has not yet impacted the local area (such as a predicted flood), or (b) when a generalized threat exists and there is no identifiable incident site (as may be the case for a terrorist threat). During these situations, a senior law enforcement officer will normally direct the combined efforts of local law enforcement agencies from the EOC, receiving general guidance from the Hopkins County Judge/EOC Supervisor, and coordinating as necessary with the law enforcement agencies concerned and other emergency functions.
- 4. External response agencies are expected to conform to the general guidance provided by our senior decision-makers and carry out mission assignments directed by the Incident Commander or the EOC. However, organized response units will normally work under the immediate control of their own supervisors.

B. Incident Command System- EOC Interface

If both the EOC and an ICP are operating, the Incident Commander and the EOC must agree upon a specific division of responsibilities for emergency response activities to avoid duplication of effort and conflicting guidance and direction. The EOC and the ICP must maintain a regular two-way information flow. A general division of responsibilities between the ICP and the EOC that can be used as a basis for more specific agreement is provided in Section V of Annex N, Direction & Control.

C. Continuity of Government







SITUATIONAL AWARENESS BRIEF TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE AND POTENTIAL IMPACTS TO DISTRICTS

OVERVIEW

On Monday, April 8, 2024, South Texas will be the first to observe almost four and a half minutes of total darkness as the 2024 Total Solar Eclipse moves across the United States. Current estimates show that over one million people will visit Texas to view this rare, natural phenomenon. Visitors from all over the United States are expected to arrive the weekend before the eclipse and leave the area on Tuesday and Wednesday (April 9-10, 2024). This temporary increase in population, vehicles, and tourism will produce cascading effects on local resources for many communities in the path of totality and a minimum of 50 miles outside the path. School districts within or near the path of totality should consider all the risks and potential disruption of the educational process, solicit feedback from stakeholders, and make an informed decision.

INTRODUCTION

The solar eclipse in Texas will start to occur on April 8, 2024, around 1:30 pm CST near Del Rio and Eagle Pass. Approximately 12 million Texans will be within the path of totality (https://www.greatamericaneclipse.com/). Viewers across all of Texas will experience some level of totality, the eclipse you will have in your exact location:

https://eclipse2024.org/communities/USA/states/Texas/.

What is a solar eclipse? NASA explains a solar eclipse as "the Moon passing between the Sun and Earth, casting a shadow on Earth that either fully or partially blocks the Sun's light in some areas." (https://science.nasa.gov/eclipses/types/). If you live within the path of totality, the moon will completely block the sun, leaving just a ring known as the Ring of Fire. If you live outside the path of totality, you will experience what is known as a partial eclipse, which means that the Sun, Moon, and Earth are not in exact alignment; you will witness a crescent-shaped sun.

SIGNIFICANCE

Total solar eclipses occur on average every 375 years for any location. Texas had its last total solar eclipse in 1900. Aside from the awe-inspiring beauty, an eclipse allows scientists to study the Sun's outer atmosphere, explore the motion and interaction of celestial bodies within our solar system, and understand the life cycles of stars, which helps us understand navigation and timekeeping. There has also been great cultural significance in various societies throughout history. Finally, solar eclipses are captivating and inspire people of all ages to become interested in science and astronomy. Educational initiatives surrounding eclipses help raise awareness and foster a love for science.

Due to the solar eclipses' uniqueness, communities within the path of totality will see a dramatic increase in visitors in the days leading up to the event. In 2017, Wyoming was named the best state to view the total solar eclipse; the state doubled in size in one weekend (The Denver Post). Texas has been dubbed the best state to view the 2024 total eclipse. Many communities across the path of totality have already sold out of hotel rooms. Due to the tremendous influx of visitors across

the state, roadways will be packed and at a standstill before, during, and immediately following the eclipse. All states that experienced the 2017 eclipse reported massive traffic jams after the eclipse was over. Travel times doubled and even tripled in some areas, leaving some motorists looking to refuel at gas stations, but those stations ran out of fuel (Dailymail.com).

WEATHER

One of the reasons Texas will be the number one state to view the eclipse is its climate. April 8th has historically been a day with comfortable weather and clear, dry skies. Texas boasts the best weather forecast along the path in April, an excellent highway system, and abundant accommodations in Dallas, Fort Worth, Austin, and San Antonio. Some cities with long durations of totality include Eagle Pass, Uvalde, Kerrville, Fredericksburg, Llano, Lampasas, Killeen, Waco, Sulphur Springs, and the southeastern suburbs of Dallas.

A remarkable fact is that the entire metropolitan area of Dallas and Fort Worth, a megalopolis of seven million people, is entirely inside the path of totality. For eclipse viewing, mobility is essential, especially in the case of inclement weather. Interstate 10 from Junction to San Antonio in Texas is within the path of totality and offers quick relocation if clouds threaten viewing. The long stretch of Interstate 35 from Austin to Waco to Fort Worth and Dallas will be a crucial route for many eclipse chasers, an ideal traffic corridor if relocation is needed (https://www.greatamericaneclipse.com/texas-2024-eclipse). However, this movement to gain a better vantage point only applies before the eclipse since it will take a mere 17 minutes for the eclipse to move from South to North Texas.

NATURE

Animals and nature change their habits during a solar eclipse. Many animals have been observed carrying out their 'night-time' rituals as the eclipse evolves. During the 2017 solar eclipse, many folks observed their hens heading back to the nest to roost, birds starting to flock and fly during the eclipse, and even bears leaving their meal to head back quickly into the woods out of sight. Many daytime-flowering plants temporarily closed their flowers during the darkness of an

eclipse, reopening them when the sunlight returned

(https://www.inaturalist.org/observations/7596133). In addition to nature, the eclipse can affect the human body.

SOLAR ECLIPSE SAFETY

Observing a solar eclipse can be an exciting and memorable experience, but it's crucial to prioritize safety. Looking directly at the sun, even during an eclipse, can cause severe eye damage or permanent blindness. Here are some safety tips for observing a solar eclipse:

- o Create a pinhole projector, a simple and indirect method of viewing the eclipse.
- o Do not look through the pinhole; instead, project the image onto a surface.

Solar Filters for Cameras:

 If you plan to photograph the eclipse, use a solar filter designed for cameras to protect your eyes and avoid damaging your equipment.

· Telescopes and Binoculars:

 If using telescopes or binoculars, ensure they are equipped with solar filters for safe solar viewing.

· Solar Eclipse Glasses for Children:

 Ensure that children use solar eclipse glasses properly and supervise them during the observation.

Avoid DIY Solutions:

 Do not use improvised filters, CDs, DVDs, sunglasses, or any other makeshift solutions, as they do not provide adequate protection.

Remember, eye safety is paramount, and proper eye protection is critical when observing a solar eclipse. Always follow recommended safety guidelines and use approved solar viewing methods to enjoy the eclipse safely.

CLOSURES

Baylor Scott & White and Seton hospitals have canceled all elective surgeries in Central Texas. To get the most accurate and up-to-date information about closures or events related to the April 8, 2024, solar eclipse in Texas, check with local authorities, other schools, Chambers of Commerce, emergency managers, and news sources closer to the date. You can visit the official websites or social media pages of Texas observatories, science centers, or astronomy organizations for information on planned events or closures.

Railroad companies will halt all traffic during the eclipse to prevent accidents in the Central Texas area and possibly across the state. Many schools across the state will be closed or have an altered schedule on the eclipse day. Updates will be provided if we learn of other significant closures.

K-12 IMPACT

In 2017, Kentucky had visitors from 47 different states and 25 countries. Most After Action Reports (AARs) from the solar eclipse mention visitors leaving as soon as the event was over; this led to backups on all roadways, leaving motorists spending up to four times the expected travel time. One stretch of I-25 in Wyoming went from a four-hour commute to an 11-hour commute. Due to the path of totality going through primarily rural areas of Texas, bus routes could see an increase in travel time that would put some students getting home past midnight.

In addition to travel times being impacted, there will be no way to stop people from parking their vehicles and getting out wherever they choose. There is a possibility that campuses could have out-of-town visitors wandering through their property. There will be no way to differentiate honest spectators from bad actors.

Other potential impacts include but are not limited to:

- · Limited and overwhelmed emergency services departments:
 - Traffic congestion, potential accidents, and medical emergencies will drastically increase the response time of emergency services.
- Cell phone towers will be overloaded, and internet service will be degraded due to increased use:
 - Contacting emergency services or others will take additional time.
 - This includes credit card processing. Have some cash available for emergencies. No large bills.
- Fuel shortages and electric vehicle charging stations:
 - Expect fuel shortages. Start keeping your fuel tanks full at least two weeks prior and refuel when at ¾ of a tank.

Electric vehicle charging stations are limited in rural areas. Expect long wait times
 and charge to 100% daily starting the week before the eclipse.

Limited ability to resupply:

- Increased demand and traffic will limit the resupply of grocery stores, convenience stores, water, fuel, and other goods. Supply levels may take up to a week to return to normal levels. Plan accordingly.
- Do not expect food deliveries or trash pickup on the eclipse day.

· Parking and camping:

- Expect viewers to park anywhere they can. This includes the side of the road,
 parking lots, stadiums, etc. Unauthorized camping may take place in the same locations.
- o If the grass in unimproved parking areas is tall and dry, fires may occur.

Hotels, RV campsites, and other lodging:

 Lodging in the path of totality is already 100% booked. If this is the case in your area, you can expect many visitors.

CONCLUSION

Texas will have the number one viewing spot in the United States for the April 8, 2024, total solar eclipse. The weather should be nice, the time of totality will be 4 minutes and 27 seconds (https://www.timeanddate.com/eclipse/map/2024-april-8), and there are plenty of vast, open spaces to enjoy the viewing. However, you want to make sure you are prepared for this celestial event by planning ahead. We suggest collaborating with your local or county emergency managers immediately if you have not done so. Ensure you are well informed and prepared and weigh the advantages and disadvantages of remaining open on that day. Finally, ensure you have appropriate eyewear for yourself and others while viewing this unique phenomenon and enjoy this rare opportunity.





On April 8, 2024 the counties of Hunt, Hopkins, Rains and Smith will experience a rare phenomenon - a total eclipse. They are located are on the central line of totality which make them prime viewing sites. These counties have major Interstate highways which could experience significant traffic delays. These counties where the cities of Greenville, Sulphur Springs and Tyler are located expect local population to double in the days leading up to this event and this surge of visitors could put strains on first responders, fuel, hospitals, food and traffic.

The Emergency Planning Committees in each of these counties have been working to handle this influx of visitors with coordinated efforts of First Responders but anticipate a need for real-time information on traffic corridors, event venues, and infrastructure for public safety. CAP has been asked to provide aerial transport of first responders in each of these areas to provide EOCs with radio communications and photographs for operational period planning.


